1st Lieutenant's Division maintains NAVSTA appearance

Maintaining the beauty of Naval Station (NAVSTA) Great Lakes is the primary job of the 1st Lieutenant's Division.

"We handle the supply side and the maintenance side," said QMCS(SW) Denise Flores, leading chief petty officer of the division. This includes trash pickup along the streets, on the grass, and at Pettibone Creek, and trash

collection from receptacles, as well as painting curbs throughout NAVSTA.

"We also supply plants to commands throughout the base, and are distributing perennials now so that they will be grown by the fourth of July celebration," Flores noted.

The division uses equipment such as John Deere tractors which have multi-purpose uses, including snow removal and cutting grass, in areas which are not taken care of by contract, said ABE1 Larry

Pugh, leading petty officer.

"We're also mostly responsible for clearing the sidewalks in winter at Naval Station, You don't actually know what goes into maintaining the base until you do it," Pugh noted.

The division's work also includes maintaining the Marina area, explained FC2 Jorge Delreal, who said he enjoys his work, especially the landscaping part. "It's a change from living on a ship," he explained.

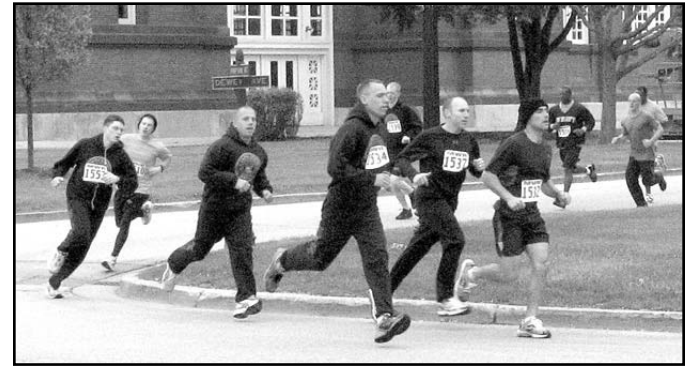
Winners of nurse corps run announced
